School Description: The Cunniff School is located in the west end of Watertown on 246 Warren Street. There are approximately 300 PreKindergarten through grade five students at Cunniff. The Cunniff was built in 1953 and was the first complete building to be constructed in the town's postwar construction program. Named after Judge Cunniff, the school community was defined by its dedication to the education of its students. To this day, the Cunniff is supported by a strong and active community of faculty, staff, parents, guardians and students.

General review of the process that was used by the School Site Council to determine the School Improvement Plan goals along with a general sense of the data that were considered:

The School Site Council met monthly during the 2017-18 academic year. The Council reviewed the existing School Improvement Plan and learned about the District's vision, standards-aligned curriculum, and the professional development program. Additionally, they received an overview of the efforts in place to finalize a standards-based report card and to add a social emotional program (Responsive Classroom) at the elementary level, beginning in September. The Council also brainstormed ideas for school improvement and these included extending the home/school partnership and planning events reflective of the School's diversity.
